Primary aim is to prevent admissions to hospital and keep people in their usual place of residence for as long as possible. We accept anyone with a diagnosis of dementia or a suspected dementia. As a result of no dementia inpatient beds on the Island the DOT formed and is a new service and is still evolving and developing. The MDT that we liaise with are: GPs, adult social care, Age UK, District nurses. Internally we liaise with psych liaison and memory service, wards, CRRT. Referrals come from members of the public to professionals around the Isle of Wight, there is no wrong door. We will support anyone to seek the correct care
