### LEARNING ENVIRONMENT PROFILE

General Information	The team provides physical rehabilitation for patients either in their usual place of residence (own home or care home) and also in 38 Community Rehab beds located at Springfield NH and Laidlaw Community unit. Patients are referred from other HCP in both primary and secondary care.
Description of Service and Client Group	Individualised rehab plans and goals are developed in partnership with patients and the MDT. The MDT consists of Nurses, OTs, Physios, rehab assistants, associate practitioners, social care practitioners, pharmacist, advanced care practitioner and Medical officer (GP). The team aim to maximise patients potential to live as independently and safely as possible. The service accepts referrals for patients aged 18 and over.
Description of related services & Client group	Falls team, Laidlaw, SALT, Single point of assessment (SPA), integrated discharge team (IDT)
